


Magnitude of gender-based violence in Mongolia


SITUATION ANALYSIS

Response of the Government of Mongolia to the national priorities on GBV

- Mongolia has ratified 12 UN Human rights conventions
- The Government accepted all the 2017 Universal Periodic Review recommendations provided by the UN Human Rights Council on GBV
- The National Action Program to Enhance Public Legal Education (2018) envisaged on improvement of primary legal assistance in terms of quality and access.
- The first Law to Combat Domestic Violence was adopted in 2004.
- The newly amended Law came into force 1 Feb. 2017



NEWLY AMENDED LAW ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE



- Improved framework on protecting victims, specified services to victims
- A child victim of violence taken under special protection new legislation on domestic violence
- Criminalization of domestic violence, including stalking and threats;
- Domestic violence: petty offence and crime;
- Explicit responsibilities of institutions working on preventing and combating domestic violence;
- Establishment of domestic violence units within police departments






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
